Common Table Mission Statement: Common Table welcomes all to a nutritious meal in a joyful environment, feeding body and soul within a caring community.

Common Table Dinest

Approximately 50 Individuals make Common Table a reality every Thursday.

- 4 local Chefs 1 per week to plan a meal and supervise the cooking at St. John's kitchen
- 40 community volunteers 20 per week for food prep, serve and cleanup
- 20 dessert donors 3 each week coordinated by a dessert coordinator
- An Easter Seals cooking class held at the St. John's kitchen that leaves the cookies they make
- 20 Montessori School children volunteer 4 to 5 a week with their teacher serve and cleanup
- 6 LifeShare participants, a program for people with disabilities with 3-4 aides help clean tables and stack chairs

The atmosphere at a Common Table meal is one of community. The tables are set with 10 place settings and with fresh flowers. The drinks, meals and dessert are served to each guest by a volunteer. A local musician plays the piano and is sometimes accompanied by 1 to 3 other musicians.

I love the dignity with which everyone is treated. It's wonderful to be served at the table, rather than walking through a food line. This is a wonderful ministry. THANK YOU.

Common Table Diner

A Common Table meal consists of salad, protein, vegetable, starch, beverage and dessert. Every meal begins with a choice of beverage: juices, water, milk, coffee or tea; and ends with a choice of dessert: cookies, brownies, ice cream, cupcakes. Example main courses:

- kielbasa with peppers and mushrooms; macaroni and cheese; tomato, lettuce and cucumber salad
- roasted chicken breast, rice with green peppers, coleslaw

Common Table happens every Thursday, except Thanksgiving. There is also a Christmas Day dinner.
