Treasurer's Report: Kelly

Executive Summary:

- Income lower than budget expectations due to lower pledge offerings for YTD partially offset by higher plate offerings. Our budget assumes \$540K in pledges, current commitment is approximately \$460K. We have a gap to close!
- Parking income lower due to timing of parking donations for passes. Expenses essentially within budgeted expectations with a few exceptions due to timing plus the continued higher maintenance costs this year associated with boiler repairs.

Audit Update:

• 2019 we will have another full audit (similar to 2016)

Endowment Draws 2019:

• Planned \$64,074 for this year. Won't use until cash flow is needed. Took less than planned last year.

Other Notes:

Revenue for month lower by \$25,000

- Unfavorable pledge offering (we have a gap to close)
- Plate offerings lower by \$1.2K
- Metered parking favorable by \$950
- Parking Lot unfavorable by \$11.3K (timing)

Expenses higher by \$5,000

- Utilities
- Maintenance on boiler emergency
- Possible accrual reversal on audit (good news)

Stewardship Update:

- Dual campaign complicated things for people. Unlike last year, when we were finished in December and went over, we went into the year with a much lower number.
 - Letters, messaging, phone night, identified regular givers and ask them to make a pledge, more letters to those who pledged last year and didn't yet this year
 - Will know more in a week of two

Grant Updates:

- Group has been meeting & doing a lot of work
- NH LCHIP (Land and Community Heritage Investment Program) Grant given each year funded by real estate transactions and designed to preserve historic structures
 - Historic structures for restoration and preservation (roof, walls, improve original structure)
 - Late April meeting
 - Letter of intent due 5/17
 - Grant due 6/28
 - Awarded in December
 - Need to get some people to bring pieces together (Tuesday 4/9 4pm)
